In keeping with the theme "Past, Present, and Future", throughout the year our established programmes will feature several key events including an exhibition reflecting four decades of the company's work; a short film highlighting our engagement and impact within Lewisham and the wider community; a new production entitled Kehã Seebii (for those left behind), a work motivated by the tragic New Cross fire in 1981, and we will conclude the celebrations at the end of the year with a **BIG Anniversary Dance**. Reflecting on a few highlights from the past three months, we are still buzzing from the success of GROUNDATION: Dancing from the Archive production, which closed its autumn season with two sell-out performances at our homebase at Moonshot Centre. Validated by Goldsmiths, University of London, we launched our new MA Diasporic Dance styles and welcomed a new intake of first-year students to the BA (Hons) Diverse Dance styles. As part of Black History Month (BHM) IRIE! partnered with the Deptford Caribbean Forum and students from Grinling Gibbons Primary School to deliver our Vintage Tea programme engaging over 80 local elders. Sadly, we said a fond goodbye to Connah Talyor, our Education and Community Engagement Coordinator and wish him the very best in his new post.

As we continue to plan for the coming year, we are excited to have international dancer and choreographer, Vincent Mantsoe and our very own Nii Kwartey Owoo to deliver the first two-day Making Tracks professional development programme of 2025!
